Gyalshing District, is a district of the Indian state of Sikkim. 2. ABOUT GYALSHING DISTRICT





The Gyalshing district is the one of the six districts of Sikkim, which means the king's Garden, is believed to have once been the royal gardens attached to the palace at Rabdentse, Sikkim's capital till the 18th century. The area of district is 872 sq.km and it lies between 27.17' North latitudes and 88.15' East longitude. The headquarter of the district is at Gyalshing, also known as Geyzing. The town has large Nepali population, and the Nepali language is the predominant language of the region. The town is situated at an altitude about 6,500 feet (1,900m). The town enjoys a temperate climate for most of the year and snow sometimes falls in the vicinity. Other important towns includes Pelling, Yuksom, Dentam, Darap and Bermiok. The district shares its borders with Namchi district in the East and Soreng district in the southern part. It also has an international border with Nepal in its west. Gyalshing is around 120 km away from the capital city Gangtok. The nearest railway station is New Jalpaiguri (around 140 km), the nearest airport is Pakyong (around 130 km).

The Gyalshing district was previously knowns as West district which was the then second largest district of Sikkim and now the west district has been bifurcated into two different districts namely Gyalshing and Soreng in April 2022. Since Gyalshing District and Soreng District were declared as separate districts, no census has been conducted since then. So the figures given here may not be accurate. However, an attempt has been made to give accurate figures with the help of several references.

4. DISTRICT ECONOMIC PROFILE

The main economic activity is agriculture. Large cardamom, ginger, orange and vegetables are the main crops in the district, despite the most of the land being unfit for cultivation due to the difficult landscapes and rocky slopes.

Agriculture in hill sates had always been a challenge. The technological intervention added during the last few decades which have changed the face of agriculture in many developed and developing countries tremendously, failed to change the scenario in the hills due to physiographic and geographic reasons. This led to the thinking of an alternative system best suited to these hilly terrains.

Primary sector profile

- Avital component of primary sector agriculture occupies dominant position in the district in terms of dependency for livelihood and employment. paddy, Mize, Millet, Fruits, Pulses are the main crops in the district.
- Horticulture has assumed greater significance in the district and makes handsome contribution to the district economy. The major fruits grown in the district are Orange, Guava, Banana, Kiwi and Papaya.
- Livestock is another major activity that provides supplementary income to large number of rural households in Gyalshing district.
